Pte Butler is reported to have died from accidental injuries which he sustained on May 26 while serving with the Essex Scottish Regiment in Germany. Details on the accident have not been disclosed.

He was born in Windsor and attended John Campbell Public School before working for the Chrysler Corporation. He enlisted on August 27, 1943, and went overseas in May, 1944.

Pte. Butler first served in Italy with the Seaforth Highlanders, then saw action in Belgium and Holland before transferring to the Essex Scottish and going to the German theatre of war.

Surviving besides his parents is one sister, Mrs. George Kidd, of Windsor.
