

James was born on July 3 1910 in Woodstock New Brunswick, the son of Harris Weston and May King (both British), of Woodstock. They were married on July 9 1899 in St John New Brunswick. His brothers were Harris Weston (also in the overseas army), Frederick Alison, Robert (also in the overseas army) and Bert Sheffield (RCAF) King. His sisters were Irene Helen Brewer, Kathlyn Rose King and Marjorie Elizabeth True. And his deceased

sisters were Eveline Alice (1931), Dorothy Mabel (1937) and Constance May (1930) King.

He was a salesman and radio technician in a music store and he was member of the Anglican Church. And his sports were swimming, fishing, hunting and baseball.

He enlisted on September 1939 in Woodstock and he went thereafter on August 22 1940 overseas to the UK and he went afterwards on July 30 1944 to NW Europe.

James died of wounds on Sunday August 5 1945 age 35 due to a road accident and he was temporarily buried then in Ostercheps (NW Germany) and he was reburied on March 7 1946 in Holten.

His medals were: 1939-45 Star; France Germany Star; Defence Medal; War Medal; CVSM & Clasp.

He served with the Royal Canadian Artillery.
