

Pte Neville William Nisbet

Neville was born on August 7, 1916 in Stonewall Manitoba to Mr. Nisbet (first name unknown and died before 1945) and Lillian Nisbet of Stonewall. Neville married on December 8, 1938 in Flin Flon, Manitoba to Hazel Nisbet of Flin Flon and their children were the premarital girl Elizabeth Anne (1936) and son Donald William. (1942). His brother was Charlie A. Nisbet and his half-brother was Amy M. Davidson and his sisters were Lillian J. and Jane A. Nisbet. Neville was a millwright and a member of the Presbyterian Church.

He enlisted in Winnipeg on 22 June 1944 and then went overseas to the UK on 17 January 1945. On 17 March 1945, Neville was sent to the front in NW Europe.

Neville was killed in action on Wednesday, May 2, 1945 at the age of 28, during a battle near Bad Zwischenahn in Germany. He was then temporarily buried there and reburied in Holten on 16 March 1946.

His grave was adopted after the war by Mr. J. v.d. Hooff from Deventer.

His medals were: 1939-45 Star; France Germany Star; War Medal; CVSM & Clasp.

He served with the Lincoln & Welland Regiment.
