Port Credit Soldier Succumbs Overseas

Port Credit, June 18 (Special) — Mr. and Mrs. Thomas J. Rundle, Seneca Ave., Port Credit, have been informed that their son, Sigmn.

Francis Gerard Rundle, 23, 3rd Canadian Division Signals, died in a coma overseas on June 11. Place of his death was not given, but the last letter received from Sigmn. Rundle by his parents three days before his death was addressed from Holland.

In this letter Sigmn. Rundle said he was well and looking forward to going home soon. He also wrote that he had met his brother, Gnr. Clare Rundle, RCA, who was stationed 50 miles away in Holland.

Sigmn. Rundle was a graduate of Port Credit High School. Before enlisting four years ago he was employed by Goodyear Tire and Rubber Co., Ltd., New Toronto. His father is a veteran of the last war. Sigmn. Rundle also leaves a younger brother, Donald, and two younger sisters, Helene and Barbara, all at home.
