Harold was born on March 19 1918 in Port Lorne Nova Scotia, the son of Saul and Susan Sabean (both deceased), of Saint John, New Brunswick. He was married on April 11 1940 in St John with Josephine Marie Sabean, of St John. His uncle was Rupert Sabean.

He was a machinist 1st class and member of the Roman Catholic Church.

He enlisted on March 9 1940 in St John and he went on February 24 1944 overseas to the UK and he went thereafter to Italy on December 9 1944 and he disembarked France again on March 21 1945. He took then part of the operation Cannonsnot in East-Holland.

Harold was killed in action on Friday April 13 1945 age 27 near the hamlet Posterenk and he was temporarily buried there before being reburied on January 24 1946 in Holten.

At his headstone: TOO DEARLY LOVED TO EVER BE FORGOTTEN. LOVING WIFE JOSEPHINE

His medals were: 1939-45 Star; Italy Star; France Germany Star; Defence Medal; War Medal; CVSM & Clasp.

There was unveiled in September 2020 a plaque at the mill of the hamlet of Posterenk for the six fallen soldiers of below mentioned regiment.

He served with the Carleton & York Regiment.
