

Private Gerald Garth SAUVE

Believed to have been the batman for Lt. Col. Fred K. Japerson, Gerald Garth Sauve is reported missing, believed killed, following the attack on Dieppe on 1 October 1942.

A wire received by his wife Mrs Ona Sauve, brought the tidings that the young man had apparently followed his leader into the battle and shared his fate.

The 34-year-old soldier has been overseas with The Essex Scottish Regiment for more than two years, having joined up in Windsor after several years of employement with the Heinz Company in his home town.

He was a native of Leamington and attended school in that town until he accepted his position with the Heinz firm. Two brothers of Gerald are still with The Essex Scottish and are believed to be safe, although no official word regarding either of them has come to the wife of the private, who is employed at the Yellow Cab Company in Windsor.
