

Lieutenant Cyril Douglas SHARMAN 03-F-16

Lieutenant Cyril D Sharman died on April 23, 1945 at the age of 33. He was the

eldest of the five children of Harry and Gertrude Sharman of St. Vital, Manitoba, and was survived by his wife Ada M. Sharman of Winnipeg.

His brother recalls on 27 October 2001:

Cyril died 12 days before the end of the war. He grew up in the North of Winnipeg and attended Luxton and St. John's Technical schools. He was an avid hunter, curler, a very good golfer and loved to play bridge. Prior to the start of the war, Cyril was in the Winnipeg Light Infantry Reserve. He was one of the first groups of instructors at Portage la Prairie and Wainwright, Alberta. His nephew, Cyril R. Sharman is honoured to be named after him.

Sharman Lake, south of Kasba Lake was named after him in 1972.
