

L. Cpl. Frederick Richard SHEPHERD 12-D-13



Lance Cpl. Frederick R. Shepherd, son of Wilfred Richard and Florence Mabel Shepherd of Ottawa, Ontario, has been killed in action in Friesland in the North of the Netherlands, according to word received by his parents. He was recently mentioned in Canadian Press despatches when he brought in some prisoners in the battle of Hochwald Forest from whom the Canadians were able to obtain vital information. Lance Cpl. Shepherd came to Ottawa from Erskine, Alberta, three years ago. He attended the Technical High School and enlisted in the army in 1943. Arriving overseas in April 1944, he took part in the D-day invasion and was wounded four days later. After treatment in hospital he returned to duty in October 1944. Frederick Shepherd was 21 years old. In addition to his parents, he is survived by two brothers, Bob with the Canadian Army in Germany and Frank at home and two sisters Dorothy and June, at home. Frederick Richard Shepherd served with The Queen's Own Rifles of Canada.
